The Nativity of Christ at Bethesda

It was incredibly exciting to celebrate the 100th anniversary of our church building several months ago. I still talk about the service, video, reception, and the displays that are in the Memorial Room. Before we end the year 2023, I wanted to continue that historical experience into our Christmas services. I found a cantata by Caleb Simper that was copyrighted (I am also assum-

ing composed) in 1896, the same year that our church was named Bethesda. The mural downstairs states: "As the church flourished and continued to grow, at the suggestion of Mr. E. W. Windsor, the beautiful biblical name of 'Bethesda'-House of Mercy and Healing was adopted in 1896 as the official name of the church."

The cantata includes some carols that are new to me, and I am planning to include some of the solos, choruses, and carols in our services during Advent and on Christmas Eve at 11:00. I will include notations in the bulletin that the works are from the 1896 Cantata, "The Nativity of Christ."

Simper was a Victorian era English musician and composer who wrote music that was accessible to non-professional church choirs. While critics may have panned his works because of the intended performers and audience, I believe that someone who creates music accessible for the worship of a large, diverse group of faithful members is performing an important service to Christianity. If a song, anthem, poem, scripture, or other art form brings someone to a closer walk with God, that work is as effective as famous compositions, sculptures, and paintings.

As I noted in last month's newsletter, our **Chancel Choir Cantata will be presented at the 11:00 am service** on Sunday December 17. Sherri has created some staging that will provide a visual dimension to the cantata and there will be some narration and solos that will be moving and inspirational.

I am looking forward to you joining us for the Cantata on December 17 at 10:30 am and the Christmas Eve service at 11:00 pm on December 24. The Christmas Eve service will feature the Chancel Choir, brass, and our Handbell Choir. Merry Christmas from my family to yours! See you in church, Jeff



Bethesda's Budget for 2024

The approved budget for Bethesda will be \$413, 664 for the calendar year of 2024. Our overall budget continues to be reduced due to changes with income, and thus reducing expenses associated with staffing requirements, maintenance efficiencies and ministry programs. In 2023, the budget was \$441,387, and in 2022 the budget was \$455,157. The budget for 2024 is reflective of our actual income and expenses from 2022 and 2023.


For this year, as of the end of October, our income from January through October was \$336,976, compared to a planned budget income of \$367,882. With planed expenses for November and December, we are tracking behind our income objective for 2023.

Please review the Income and the Expense Pie Charts for the 2024 budget below, detailing the categories of each. As you will see 92% of our income comes from the offerings that each of you provide to Bethesda. Without you, we would not have a church. The fundraiser category highlighted consists of the income from our monthly luncheons and annual Fall Festival.



Expenses for 2024 are detailed below. Staffing and Apportionment make up the two largest expense categories. Approximately 50% of the expenses are associated with Salaries and Wages for the Senior and Associate Pastors, Administrative Assistant, Bookkeeper, Custodian, Director of Traditional Music, and Director of Contemporary Music.




