

United Women in Faith January, 2023

Happy New Year! A new year full of opportunities. One of my favorite quotes is "Carpe Diem." (It's one of the few phrases I remember from high school Latin class!) It means "Seize the day!" I found this devotional from Rev. Joel Sheeress, the pastor at First Christian Reformed Church in Crown Point, Indiana, which has inspired me to focus on making the most of every opportunity God sends my way. I hope it inspires you as well.

"Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. Colossians 4:5 Do you remember Ashley Smith? One day in March 2005 she came home to find a fleeing murderer waiting for her. He held her hostage for several hours at gunpoint. During that time, she did something extraordinary; she took advantage of the opportunity and witnessed to her captor. She cooked him breakfast, read from Rick Warren's book The Purpose-Driven Life, and talked about God's plan for his life and about Christ. Later the man peacefully gave himself up to the police.

Our text for today reminds us, "Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity." God often presents us with opportunities to witness, but we often let them slip by because we're not wise enough to see them for what they are.

The apostle Paul says we are "God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10). God often places good works before us in the form of opportunities to share our faith with people who are outside the faith. But we need to be wise and willing enough to make the most of those opportunities.

As we enter a new year, we need to remember that each new day brings opportunities to serve the Lord and express our faith to others, sometimes in strange and different situations.

Lord, we have often let many opportunities pass by. Give us the wisdom, we pray, to see each opportunity you place before us to do your will and share our faith. In Jesus, Amen.



Remember that Bethesda is built on the "cruciform principle". The floor of the church makes a perfect design of the cross. Starting at the pulpit "crossing of the Cross", then we have the vertical arms of the Cross.

Moving into the Nave from the pulpit (on your right, after Abraham and Moses), we have David, wearing his kingly crown - the iconic leader of the Hebrew people. His symbol is the Star of David, used to this day as the sign of Judaic faith. Isaiah the Prophet stands next to David. The small symbol is that of crossed trumpets, for Isaiah was one who did not fear proclaiming the word of the Lord in the presence of Kings and Princes and even from the rooftops.



The Christian holiday commemorating the first manifestation of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles, represented by the Magi, and the manifestation of his divinity, as it occurred at his baptism in the Jordan River and at his first miracle, at Cana in Galilee. Epiphany is one of the three principal and oldest festival days of the Christian church (the other two are Easter and Christmas). Roman Catholics, Lutherans, Anglicans, and other Western churches observe the feast on January 6.

The festival originated in the Eastern church, where it at first included a commemoration of Christ's birth. In Rome, by 354 Christ's birth was being celebrated on December 25 (Christmas), and later in the 4th century the church in Rome began celebrating Epiphany on January 6. In the Western church the festival primarily commemorates the visit by the Magi to the infant Jesus, which is seen as evidence that Christ, the Jewish Messiah, came also for the salvation of Gentiles. In the East it primarily commemorates the baptism of Jesus and celebrates the revelation that the incarnate Christ was both fully God and fully man.





Epiphany, also called Feast of the Epiphany, Theophany, or Three Kings' Day, (from Greek epiphaneia, "manifestation")

> In the West the evening preceding Epiphany is called Twelfth Night. The time between December 25 and January 6 is known as the Twelve Days of Christmas. Epiphany is celebrated with special pastries in many countries, and children often receive small gifts in their shoes in honor of the Magi's gifts to the infant Jesus. The holiday also has a number of traditions involving water as a reflection of Jesus' baptism, including the blessing of houses with holy wa-
