Lent began last week on Ash Wednesday, but it's not too late to set some goals for this important season. "Seeing is Believing" Our Stained Glass Windows - continued

Remember that Bethesda is built on the "cruciform principle". The floor of the church makes a perfect design of the cross. Starting at the pulpit "crossing of the Cross", then we have the vertical arms of the Cross.

As we come to the back wall, we find a wonderful picture of Jesus and the children with the inscription: "Suffer the little children to come unto me". Now today, we find the word "suffer" here to be rather archaic - it actual means "Allow the children to come unto me, and do not hinder them".

Let us pause in the Narthex for two unexpected, often overlooked treasures! First, on the wall there is a plaque in memory of Fred Paul Adkins, Chairman of the Building Committee when our present building was built in 1922-23. If we look deeply into the coat closet in the Narthex we find a real, little-known treasure, an actual piece of the cornerstone of the Broad Street Building which states: "M P Church, 1870 (MP stands for Methodist Protestant). See a picture of the cornerstone on the next page.

Help and Outreach Point of Entry, Inc.

We have seen God at work many times over the years but, it never ceases to be amazing when it happens. Our AmeriCorps volunteer has been out of work due to illness but, she has constantly been on her computer looking for free things we could use for our clients. She has managed to get a great deal of useful things such as Nike hoodies and other clothing. She asked about getting free blankets about six weeks ago and the decision was yes, as long as we got them while the weather was still cold. She ordered 1,000 free blankets which translated to eleven pallets with twelve boxes per pallet. The freight company called on a Thursday and announced that the blankets were going to be delivered the next Monday; creating a sense of panic. The church garage was half full of church equipment and miscellaneous items. One item was an electric wheelchair that had been donated several months ago and no one had expressed a need for it. That same Thursday afternoon a message was left by a gentleman who was looking for financial assistance to purchase an electric wheelchair. Fast forward to Saturday morning, we had a volunteer with a lift truck at the garage and the willingness to deliver the wheelchair to the person who needed it. While that was happening, Church members cleared the garage and we were ready for the delivery. On Monday the blankets arrived and we had enough volunteers to make things go smoothly. The word was sent out to our collaborating agencies that blankets were available and in three days more than half of the blankets were distributed. Do You Know Our Cornerstone History?

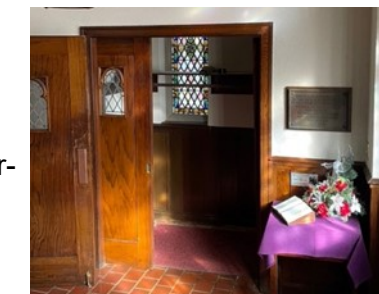


As we prepare for the **100th anniversary** celebration of Bethesda's church building on **June 4, 2023**, we have been re-discovering our church's history. What a treasury of memorabilia we have found!



Our current church on N. Division St. and William St. is Bethesda's **THIRD** location. The first meeting place was at what is now 329 Camden Ave., selected soon after our church was established in 1841. As the church membership increased, it became necessary for a larger facility to be built. In 1870, a new church was built on Broad St., across the street from Wicomico Presbyterian Church, and it became the second home to the Methodist Protestant Church.

In 1919, when the congregation and Sunday Schools numbered over 800, Bethesda's minister, Dr. Richard Shipley, encouraged members to consider building a new, larger church so the church began its search for another location. In the winter of 1921, the Todd property on the corner of N. Division St. and William St. became available and was



purchased. Ground was broken in November 1921, construction began, and the cornerstone was laid in March 1922. By June of the following year, the beautiful new church had been completed and the first service was held on June 3, 1923.

During the construction of the new church, the decision was made to incorporate the old cornerstone from the Broad St. church into the new building. It was embedded into the vestibule wall at the new location, where it remains today!

Be sure to peek in our coat closet to see that cornerstone, marked "M. P. Church, A.D. 1870." (The M.P. stood for Methodist Protestant. The name 'Bethesda' was not established until 1896.)

We are collecting photos of events/activities that have taken place over the last 100 years. Some of those events took place at BUMC and others may have been at other locations when BUMC groups traveled, such as youth group mission trips or outings of our fellowship groups. If you have photos in your collections, PLEASE contact Brenda Sawyer in the church office. She can copy those photos so that we can include them in the photo albums that we are creating to preserve these precious memories for years to come.
